
DEAR STUDENT! DEAR PARENTS!



CONDITIONS FOR RECRUITMENT OF OVERSEAS STUDENTS

All children from abroad, aged 7-18, including those who either apply for or are subject to international protection, benefit from education in public schools on the same terms as Polish children.

Students from abroad, both Polish citizens and foreigners, are admitted to public schools based on foreign documents confirming attending school abroad or completing the next stage of education, without the need to validate the documents.

Please note that public vocational schools may require additional criteria for admission.

The public school principal admits an overseas student to the relevant grade, taking into account their age, the opinion of their parent(s), or, if the student is an adult, their own opinion.



ADMISSION PROCEDURE (



Foreigners are admitted based on:

- a diploma or other document confirming the completion of a school or another stage of education abroad, recognized by separate regulations, as equivalent to the Polish certificate of completion of a relevant public school, or
- a certificate of attendace or a different document issued by an overseas school to confirm the foreigner's attendance and indicate the grade or stage of education that the student completed at a school abroad, and a document confirming the total number of years completed at an overseas school.

Then, the principal of a public school admits and qualifies the foreigner to the appropriate grade, based on the submitted documents.

IF YOU WERE ATTENDING A SCHOOL ABROAD

To become a student of our Tech School No 8, you must provide:

- school admission form in which you should indicate the chosen field of study,
- one of the documents mentioned above,
- 3 ID photos.
- declaration of choice of a subject you wish to study at an extended level.

Students who have completed at least a grade corresponding to the 8th grade of primary school in Poland may be admitted to the first grade.

If you qualify for a given grade, you will receive a referral for a medical check-up. You must submit your medical certificate to school.

IF YOU WERE ATTENDING A POLISH SCHOOL

You can get into a post-primary school if you have completed at least the 8th grade of primary school in Poland.

We kindly inform you that to become a student of Tech School No 8, you need to enter a recruitment process on the terms applicable to Polish students.

You must provide:

- school admission form in which you should indicate the chosen field of study;
- primary school leaving certificate;
- certificate containing detailed results of the eighth-grade examination.

Qualification for a field of study of your choice depends on the number of points you received. Points are awarded for grades on the primary school leaving certificate in Polish, mathematics, foreign language and physics or computer science. In addition, you will receive points for the results of the eighth grade exam and for other achievements (e.g. competitions).

Turn to the career counselor in your primary school to find out the details concerning the recruitment process.

 - your conduct mark,
 - test reminders.

 - messages from teachers or fellow students,
 - record of absence.
- 2. In the electronic grade book, your parents will find
 - information about meetings and consultations held by teachers,
 - information about your grades, behaviour and absence,
 - information about important school events,

THE MATRICULATION EXAM (THE MATURA EXAM) IS THE BASIS FOR ENTRY INTO UNIVERSITIES OR COLLEGES OF FURTHER EDUCATION.

The Matura Exam is uniform throughout the country to ensure comparability of results and objectivity of assessment. The exam consists of two parts: the oral part assessed at school, and the written part assessed by external examiners.

In Poland, the Matura Exam is always held in May. Its schedule is specified by the Director of the Central Examination Board each year.

To pass the secondary school-leaving examination, you must achieve a score of at least 30% in each of the compulsory subjects in the oral and written part and take an exam in a selected additional subject at the extended level in the written part (*no passing score is specified for this subject). However, from the 2024/2025 academic year, a score of at least 30% will also apply to the extended level exam).

ADDITIONAL SUBJECTS (optional)

• 1-5 subjects at an extended level chosen from the following: Biology, Chemistry, Philosophy, Physics, Geography, History, History of Music, History of Art, Computer Studies, Latin and Classical Civilisations, Ethnic minority language, Modern foreign language (at an extended or bilingual level), Polish, Regional language, Mathematics, Civic Education.

If you have the professional title of technician, you are exempt from this exam.

There will be facilitations for students from abroad who wish to take external examinations. A graduate whose limited knowledge of the Polish language hinders the understanding of texts may take the matriculation examination in conditions adapted to their needs and psychophysical abilities, based on a favourable opinion of the school counsellor.

Adjusting the conditions for conducting the matriculation examination include, among others, the use of appropriate teaching aids (e.g. a bilingual dictionary) and the extension of the time allowed for taking the exams.



- passing exams in all professional qualifications allows you to obtain a technician diploma in the profession taught,
- the names of the qualifications of each profession can be found in the education chapter,
- exams take place in winter (January February) and summer (June) sessions, and the exact dates are set each year by the Central Examination Board,
- each qualification exam always consists of two parts:
 - > theoretical part (to pass it, you need to get 50% of the total number of points);
 - > practical part (to pass it, you need to get 75% of the total number of points).



- in May, students in grades 3 and 4 of technical secondary school serve a compulsory apprenticeship,
- everyone is looking for an apprenticeship on their own, guided by their interests, workplace profile, internship program, and professional profile,
- internship abroad in European countries is organized for the best students as part of the Erasmus+ project.
